MISSION

Village Keepers is dedicated to helping African American families meet the challenges and opportunities of parenting a child with special needs.

- 18.8% of Black Americans live below the poverty line. 36% of Black American households are led by single parents; mothers (32%) and fathers (6%). Many of these families are underserved and have children with special needs.
- Black students with disabilities are often low income and disproportionately placed in Special Education, e.g., in California Black students represent 6% of the total population but 9% are in Special Education.
- The national incarceration rate for Black adults and young adult males is 33%. Many of these people have special needs. Often, when incarcerated they are not given mental health treatment.

THESE SATISTICS ARE UNACCEPTABLE!

Village Keepers is committed to mobilizing the Black community and allies to prevent reduce these **systemic inequities.**

The organization will help reduce the disproprotionate number of Black students assigned to special educations programs in the East & Central County school districts by fifty percent (50%) each year.
